1 Timothy 5:23


Stop drinking only water,






Prayer binds two people together

2 Timothy 1:4


Recalling your tears,

This is biblical proof that real men cry!


2 Timothy 4:9-13






Mentorship is not the exclusive responsibility of the church, nor of the home; it is the partnership between the church and home

⁵ I am reminded of your sincere faith, which first lived in your grandmother Lois and in your mother Eunice and, I am persuaded, now lives in you also.




God has not intended for pastors to parent children. Parents pastor in their homes, just as pastors pastor in the church

(2 Timothy 3:14-17)



⁴ Hear, O Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. ⁵ Love the LORD your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength.




Deuteronomy 6:4-9
