A) WATCHFULNESS

2) PRAYER IS INTERCESSION

COLOSSIANS 1:1

²⁶ In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us through wordless groans.²⁷ And he who searches our hearts knows the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for God's people in accordance with the will of God.

ROMANS 8:26-27

Intercession is not a one-time prayer,
while that in itself is meaningful and
powerful. Intercession is continuous
prayer until we see what we have been
praying for.

3) PRAYER IS EVANGELISTIC



⁵ Be wise in the way you act toward outsiders; make the most of every opportunity. ⁶ Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how to answer everyone.

⁹ For this reason, since the day we heard about you, we have not stopped praying for you.
