


# PASTORAL RELATIONSHIPS



<sup>1</sup> The word of the LORD came to me:  
<sup>2</sup> “Son of man, prophesy against the shepherds of Israel; prophesy and say to them: ‘This is what the Sovereign LORD says: Woe to you shepherds of Israel who only take care of yourselves! Should not shepherds take care of the flock?’

<sup>1</sup> The word of the LORD came to me:






# A) A WOE FOR NEGLECTING SHEEP



each of us has turned to our own way.





because they were neglected




Some have gone to other churches and that's okay, but others no longer go to church and some have even departed from the faith.







both deacons and elders





# A) RESCUE THE SHEEP






